- 1. Include a title of no more than 20 words
- 2. The maximum length of an abstract is 250 words
- 3. Use Arial 11pt for abstract text
- 4. Include all author names and institutional affiliations
- 5. Identify which author(s) will be presenting the paper
- 6. Provide an email address for the corresponding author
- 7. Email your abstract word doc to slaf.adminsouth@utas.edu.au by Monday 15 May 2017

When submitting a full paper for peer review please follow these guidelines:

- 1. Include a title of no more than 20 words
- 2. Include an abstract of no more than 250 words
- 3. Paper should be within 3000-4000 words in length, including references and footnotes
- 4. Use Arial 11pt for paper text
- 5. Include all author names and institutional affiliations
- 6. Identify which author(s) will be presenting the paper
- 7. Provide an email address for the corresponding author
- 8. Email your paper word doc to slaf.adminsouth@utas.edu.au by Monday 12 June 2017
